Extend Footpath from Rockfield to the School

The members considered the following question in the name of Councillor McGinley.
When will the footpath be extended from Rockfield to the Educate Together School on the Celbridge Road, Maynooth and will a cycle path be included?

A report was received from the Roads, Transportation and Public Safety Section informing the members that it is anticipated that this work will be completed in August this year. Unfortunately, there is insufficient space for a cycle path.

Councillor McGinley stated that it was unfortunate that a cycle path cannot be included and enquired what the width of the footpath would be, he also enquired if the road markings on the pedestrian crossing could be repainted as they were all gone and parents are concerned for children's safety. The District Engineer stated that the footpath would be 2 meters in width and that parents had been in contact with him over the lack of road markings on the pedestrian crossing, he had agreed to remark same.

Resolved that the report be noted and the road markings on the pedestrian crossing be re-marked.

Waterways Ireland Meeting

Councillor Ó Cearúil welcomed Mr John McKeown, Regional Manager and Mr Mervyn Hamilton, Senior Engineer of Waterways Ireland to the Maynooth Municipal District meeting and thanked them for accepting the members invitation to attend the meeting to answer their questions which related to matters concerning Waterways Ireland.

Mr McKeown introduced himself and Mr Hamilton to the members and outlined the rationale behind the setup of Waterways Ireland under the Good Friday Agreement, which is to manage, maintain and restore the canal network in order to make canals suitable for recreational use in conjunction with the [Greenway](#) Project.
